

NSS camp concludes at Dhopteshwar

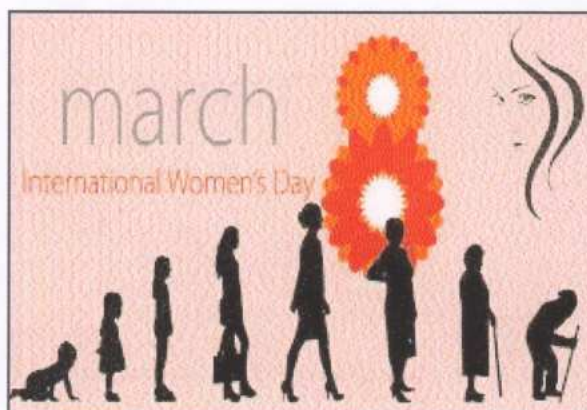
Achievers feted on Intl Women's Day

marks, ranked among the top 8 pharmacy institutions out of 91 which participated in the survey.
