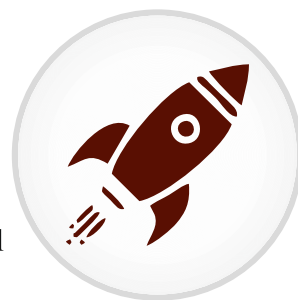

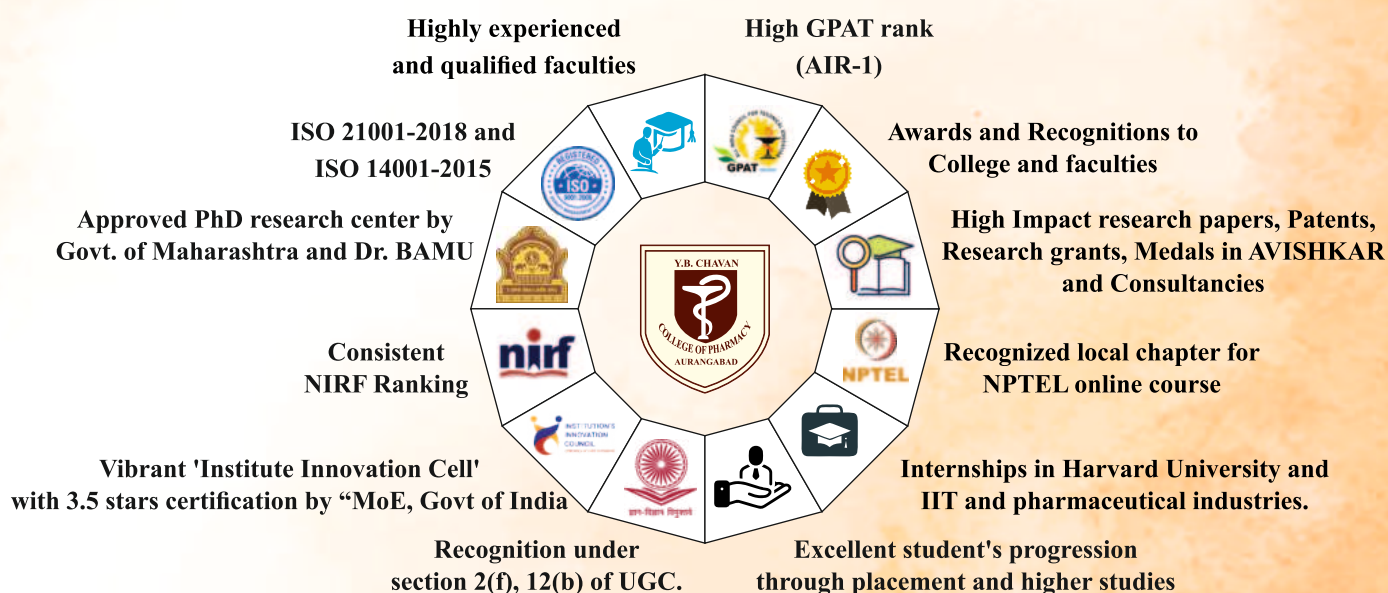

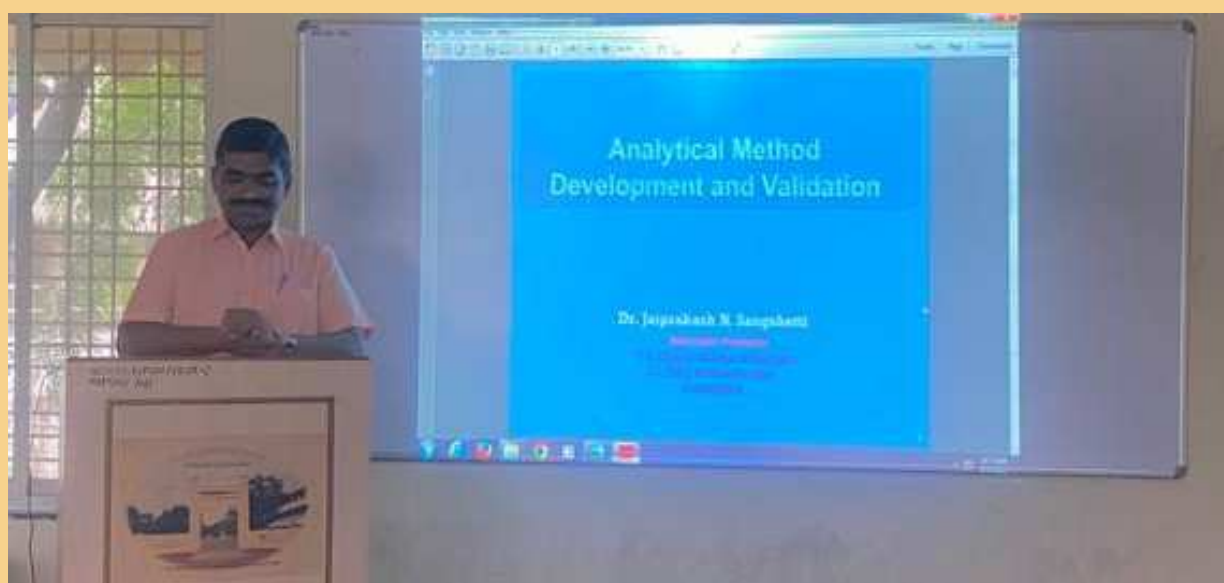


## Y. B. Chavan College of Pharmacy Hosts STTP on High-Performance Liquid Chromatography

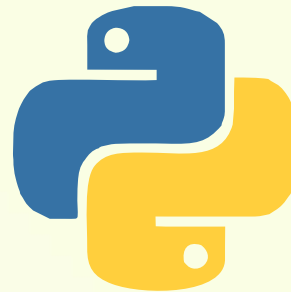


## Workshop Highlights Role of Python in Pharmacy Data Management

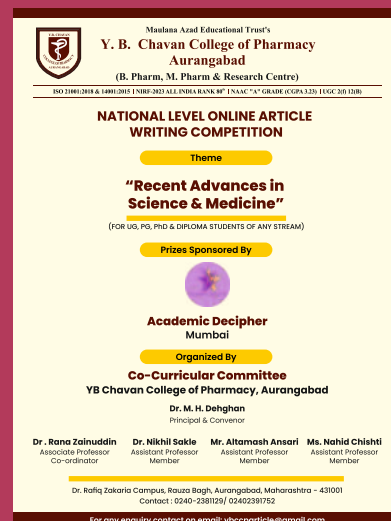

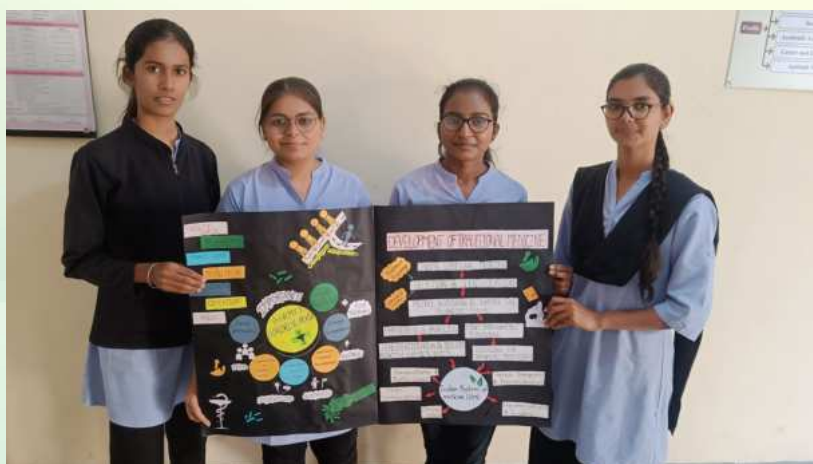

## Sirat-e-Nabi (SAW) Written Examination - "A Real Sketch of Prophet Muhammad (SAW)"

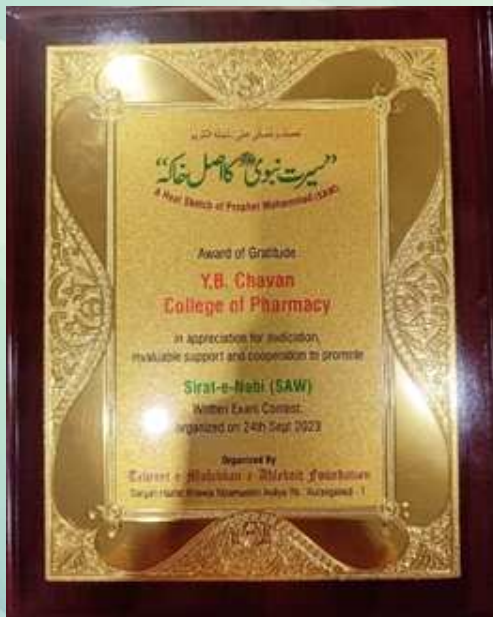

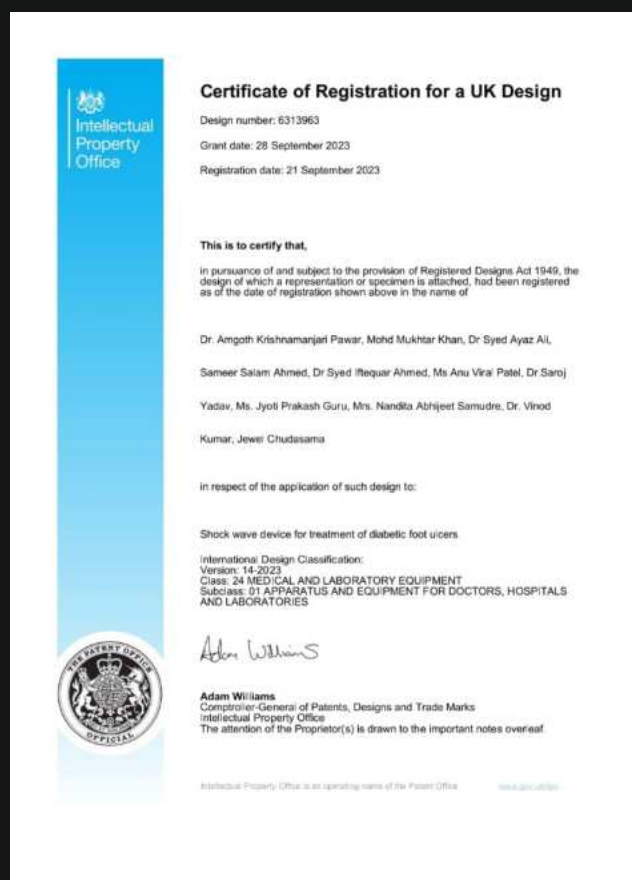
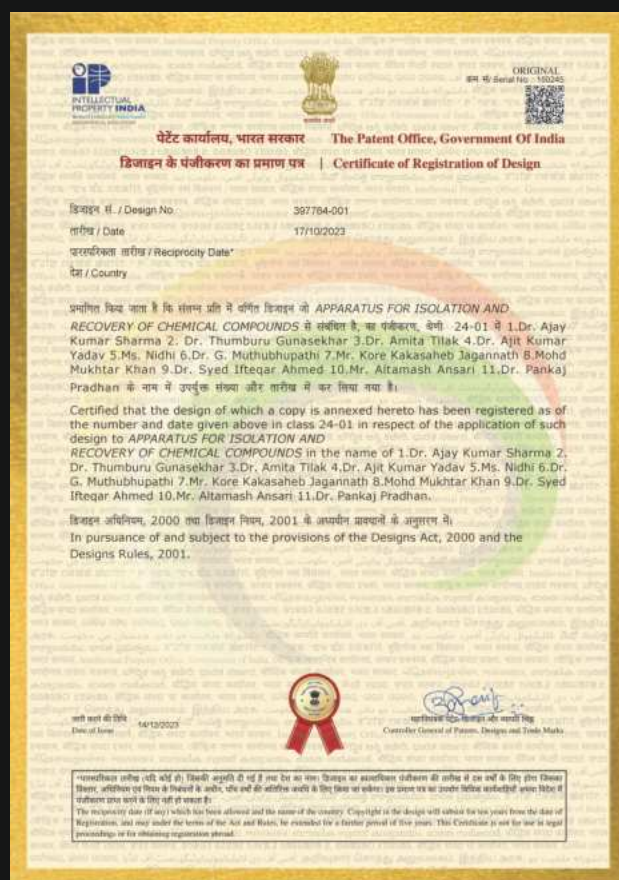


## Y. B. Chavan College Innovations Secure Patents, Uplift Scientific Landscape

# Awareness of Breast and Cervical Cancer

## **Abstract :**

Cervical cancer is the 6th most common cancer in women.

January is Cervical Cancer Awareness Month. It is a perfect opportunity for WHO and partners to raise awareness about cervical cancer and HPV vaccination. Their motive is to end cervical cancer within a few generation as the theme for cervical cancer awareness month.

## **Introduction :**

According to report by the ICMR ( Indian Council Of Medical Research), 105.4 per 100,000 women in India are undergoing treatment for breast cancer. On this cervical cancer awareness month, the messages are clear :

**Get informed :** Find out the facts about cervical cancer and the human papilloma virus (HPV) that causes it. Help educate other women in your life too.

**Get screened:** Cervical cancer screening typically starts at age 30 and is repeated periodically.

**Get vaccinated:** The HPV vaccine is given in 2 doses that should begin when a girl is between 9 and 14 years old.

**Note:** Women must undergo screening once in every 2 years

## **Risk factors for Breast cancer :**

**Age at menarche:** An early menarche is a risk factor for breast cancer.

**Breastfeeding:** Women who have not breast fed their child are at higher risk of developing breast cancer.

**Use of oral contraceptives:** The combine use of estrogen progesterone oral contraceptive pill Increases the risk factor for breast cancer. Some other factors include alcohol consumption, obesity etc

## **HPV Vaccine :**

HPV Vaccination is a Primary prevention tool and does not eliminate the need for screening later in life. HPV vaccines are now available to prevent cervical cancer. HPV vaccines have good Immunogenicity - antibodies persist for more than 10 years. Two vaccines are available for prevention of HPV infection in India, a quadrivalent HPV vaccine and the bivalent vaccine. Both the vaccines are safe and licensed for use in women above 9 years. They are to be given in 3 doses for girls above 15 years and in 2 doses for girls upto 15 years.

## **Conclusion:**

There is a need to increase knowledge of adolescent females about the risks of breast cancer and benefits of early detection

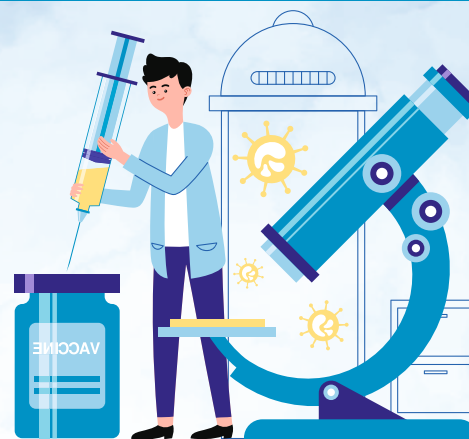

So various companies, institutes and countries collaborated in those difficult times to make the discovery of a remedy and mass production. ## PHARMACEUTICAL COLLABORATIONS DURING DEVELOPMENT OF COVID-19 VACCINES:

### Corminaty:

It is a vaccine for active immunization to prevent coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2 (SARS-CoV-2) in individuals 12 years of age and older. The Pfizer–BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine, sold under the brand name Comirnaty. It is an mRNA-based COVID-19 vaccine developed by the German biotechnology company BioNTech. For its development, BioNTech collaborated with American company Pfizer to carry out clinical trials, logistics, and manufacturing. Pfizer is a leading a pharmaceutical company with all the necessary infrastructure required to carry out intricate projects.

**ChAdOx1nCoV-19:** ChAdOx1nCoV-19, also known as the Oxford-AstraZeneca COVID-19 vaccine, is a viral vector vaccine developed to protect against the SARS-CoV-2 virus, which causes COVID-19. A vaccine contains a small piece of genetic material from the SARS-CoV-2 virus, specifically the spike protein, which is the part of the virus that allows it to enter human cells.

**Covaxin:** Covaxin was developed by Bharat biotech in collaboration with Indian medical research council and National institute of virology. It is used in the treatment of highly infectious disease COVID-19. Technology is based on whole inactivated virus technology. Development name of Covaxin is BBV152. National institute of virology India had isolated a sample of SARS CoV-2 and then they grow it to the larger quantity of virus using vero cells. After that they deactivate viruses by binding to their genes with the help of betapropiolactone (BPL). Lastly inactivated viruses mixed with aluminium based adjuvant Alhydroxyquim-II. It is approved in several countries by regulatory authorities.

### Sputnik V:

Sputnik V is a viral vector vaccine for COVID-19 developed by the Gamaleya Research Institute of

Epidemiology and Microbiology in Russia. It uses two different adenovirus vectors, Ad26 and Ad5, to deliver a modified spike protein of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19, into the body. Sputnik V demonstrated efficacy in preventing COVID-19 in clinical trials and has been authorized for emergency use in various countries.<sup>18</sup>

### •Covovax & Covovax:

Covovax is a COVID-19 vaccine developed by Novavax, a biotechnology company based in the United States, and it is being manufactured by the Serum Institute of India, one of the world's largest vaccine manufacturers. It has been shown to be effective against COVID-19 in trials conducted in various countries. The Serum Institute of India (SII) has been entrusted with the manufacturing and distribution of Covovax.

### CONCLUSION:

Hence there is need of a special platform where everyone can share their work where even small pharmaceutical Corp can participate and get necessary assistance so that collaboration can take place efficiently and within time. This can be helpful in providing instant solutions for future emerging problems in pharmaceutical industry. Collaboration helps to improve various skill set such as expertise, resources, safety and efficacy and costs effective solution, collaboration gives access to solve complex healthcare challenges for upliftment and benefits of patients and public health/ global health as a whole. Mental health is not just a problem for youths but also adults who suffer due to the stress and life problems

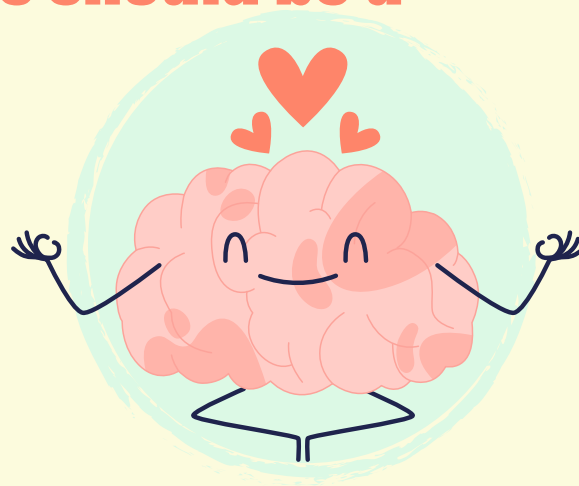

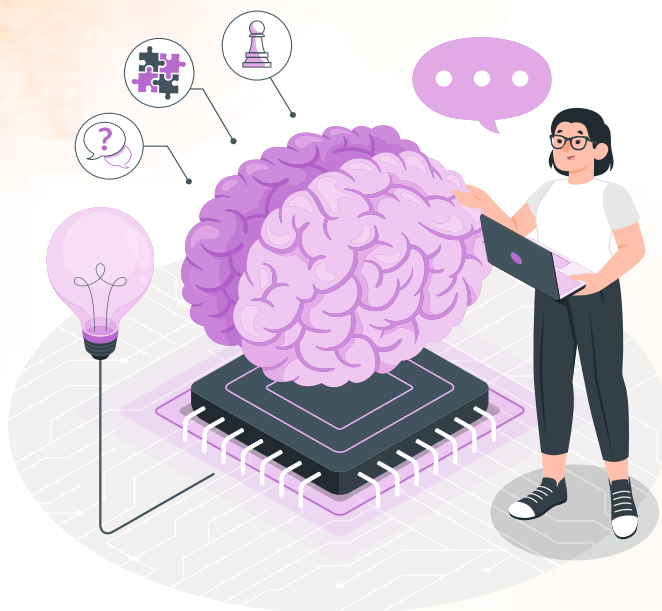


# Emotional Intelligent: A Basic Need of Life

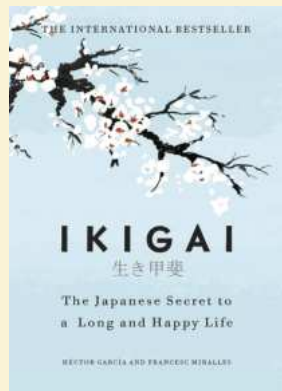


## IKIGAI: The Japanese Secret to a Long and Happy Life
