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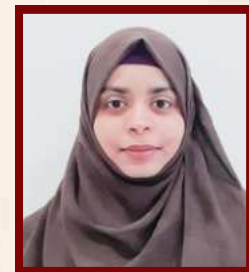

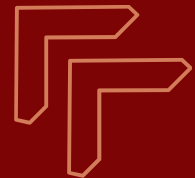

They were accompanied by faculty and students from Maulana Azad College as well. Lonar is around 150 km from Chhatrapati Sambhaji Nagar. The journey began on 7th December 2024, at 6:30 am from the college campus, and they arrived at the conference venue Lonar by 9:30 am. After registering, they attended the inauguration and four insightful scientific plenary sessions. After lunch break, the poster presentation session commenced with five of our students presenting posters on topics related to drug design and synthetic methodology.

At 4:00 pm, the group departed for a visit to Lonar Lake Sarovar, where they spent two hours enjoying the natural beauty. While walking towards the Sarovar, they witnessed several waterfalls and visited the Maa Kamalaja Mata Temple, Lonar Dhar and observed local birdlife.

Sightseeing at Lonar Lake

Lonar Lake, created by a meteorite impact, is the only known major crater in basalt rock. The lake's alkaline waters are now part of a Wildlife Sanctuary to preserve its unique ecosystem. Surrounded by lush greenery, the nearly circular lake is dotted with ancient temples along its shore. Formed approximately 52,000 years ago when a high-speed meteorite collided with basalt lava flows, the impact left the meteorite buried beneath the lake's surface.



Sightseeing in Lonar

Although the Lonar Crater was first "discovered" in 1823 by British officer C.G. Alexander, its uniqueness wasn't recognized until 1973. The Lonar Crater is the only known meteorite impact crater in basalt in the world. Today, the site preserves its historical legacy with 32 temples, 19 of which are protected by the Archaeological Survey of India. While many of these temples are in ruins, some continue to serve as active places of worship. After visit to Lonar Lake, the group moved to Ch. Sambhajinagar at 6.15 pm on the same day and reached back at 9.15pm.

The Edu-Infotainment Tour to Lonar has sparked a great deal of curiosity in the participants, enhancing their scientific understanding and appreciation for the natural wonders and beauty of this unique destination and its remarkable features.

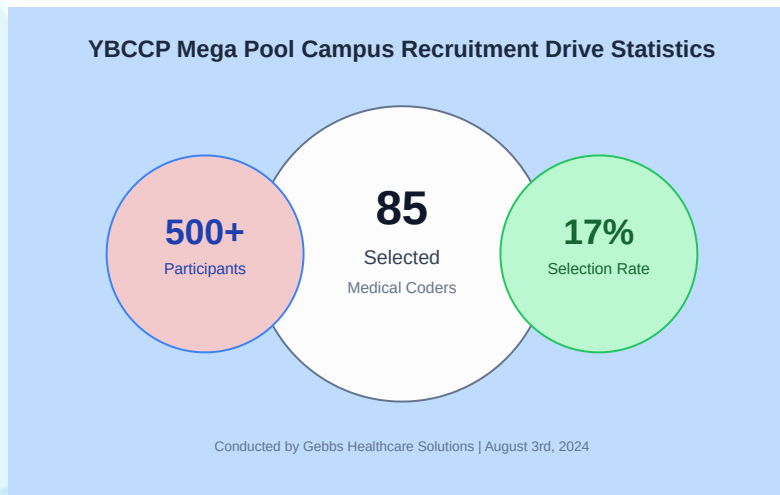

Successful Mega Pool Campus Recruitment Drive by Gebbs Healthcare Solutions, 3 August, 2024



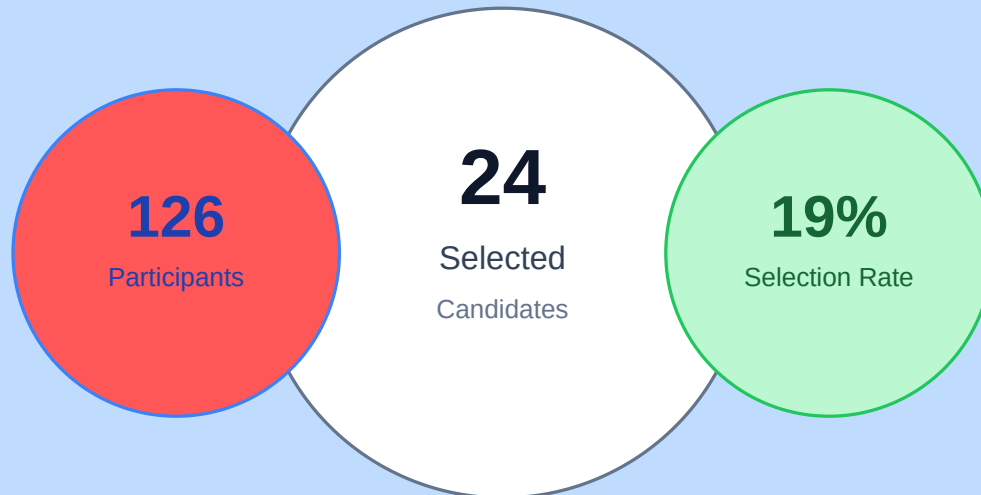

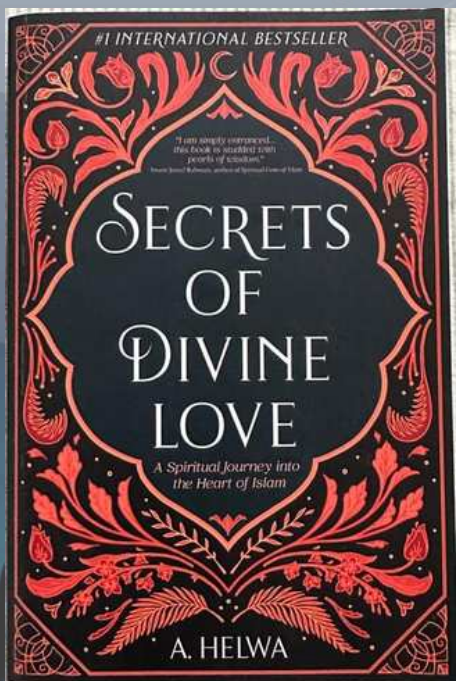


Book reviews

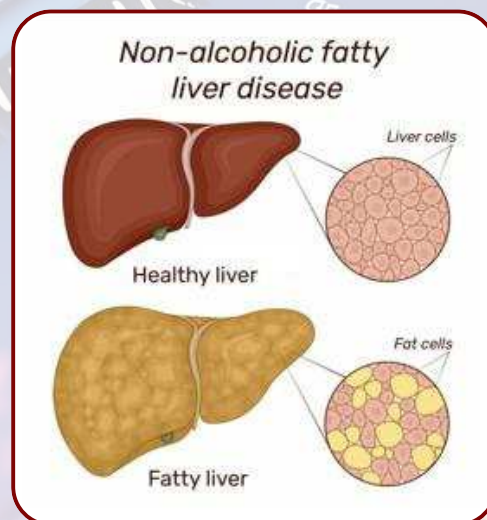
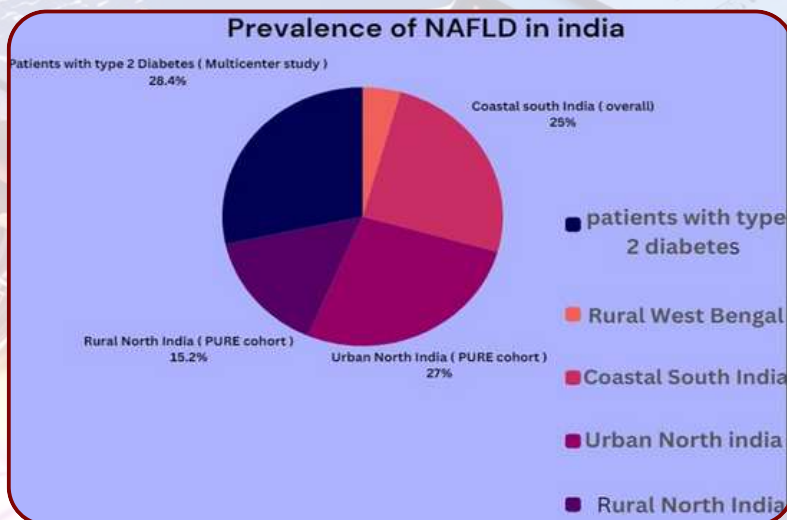
ORGAN- ON- CHIP TECHNOLOGY & AI FOR LIVER DISEASE

Non-alcoholic fatty liver disease (NAFLD) affects around 25% of adults globally and poses significant health risks, including organ failure and extra-hepatic complications. Traditional diagnostic methods, such as biopsies and imaging, often lack accuracy, complicating treatment evaluations. Organ-on-a-chip (OOC) technology offers a promising in vitro model for replicating NAFLD pathology, enabling effective drug screening. However, the complexity of data generated by OOC platforms necessitates the integration of artificial intelligence (AI) for data analysis and interpretation. AI has evolved significantly since the 1970s and is now utilized in various healthcare applications, enhancing predictive modeling and patient care.

The synergy between OOC and AI is particularly beneficial for advancing NAFLD research, allowing for the exploration of overlooked parameters and improving patient stratification. Techniques like deep learning can analyze unstructured data to identify patterns related to lipid accumulation and cellular changes. However, challenges remain, including the need for large datasets for effective machine learning training and ethical considerations surrounding data privacy. Furthermore, while AI shows potential in diagnostics and treatment, it will take time before it can fully replace human decision-making in medical practice. Overall, integrating AI with OOC technology holds promise for uncovering therapeutic targets and understanding NAFLD's complex mechanisms.

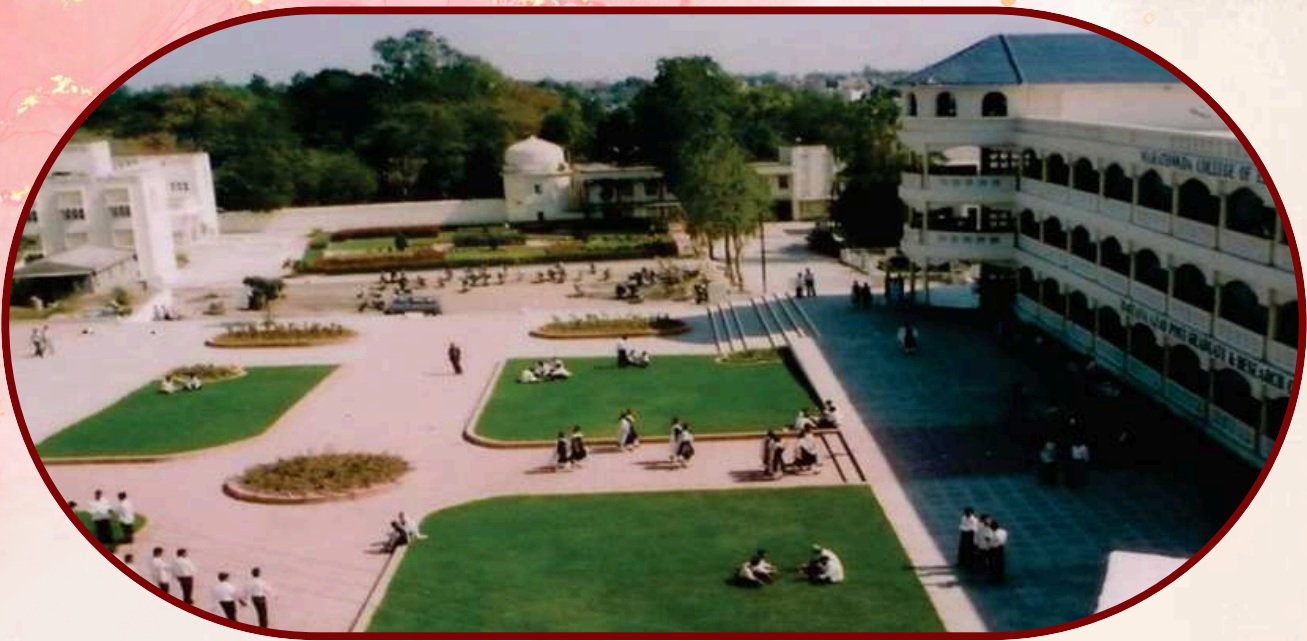
